How many triangles can you see in this picture?

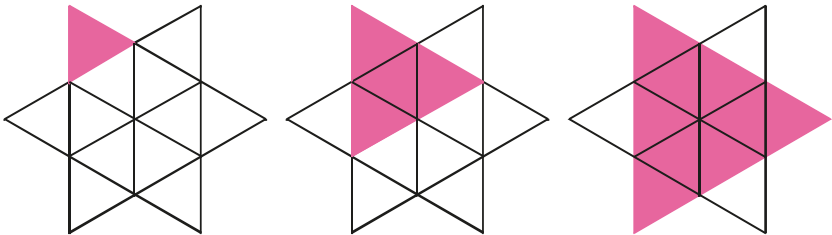
